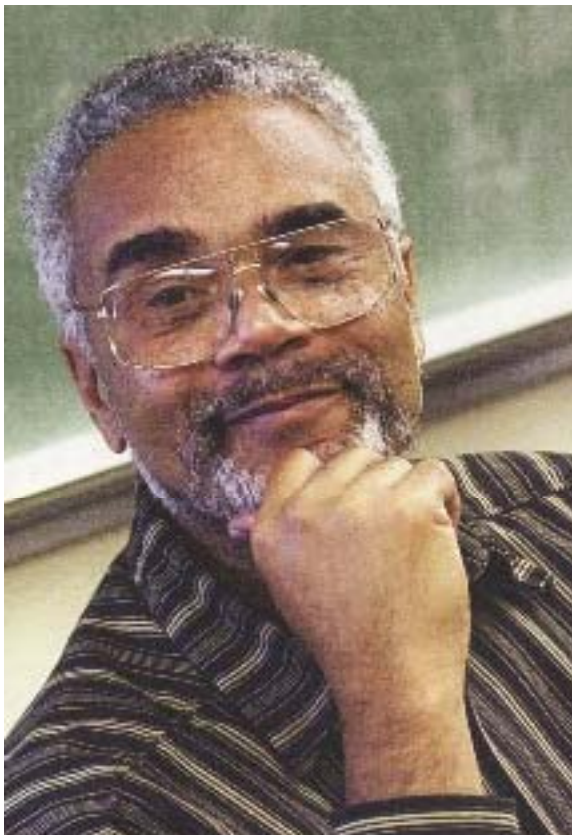

Clayborne Carson, young and radical, scholarly and brilliant, stood among 250,000 noble people as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and the feisty Spirit of love and justice set his feet on a new road toward peace and reconciliation. He turned his heart and head to SNCC and wrote an indispensable text, *In Struggle: SNCC and the Black Awakening of the 1960s*. On he marched into the head and heart of young Martin whose life, writings, and voice he makes accessible to millions like you and me.

Since then, Dr. Clayborne Carson has devoted his professional life to the study of Martin Luther King, Jr., and the movements King inspired. Dr. Carson has taught at Stanford University since 1975, where he is now professor of history and founding director of the Martin Luther King, Jr., Research and Education Institute. He is also Martin Luther King, Jr. Distinguished Professor at Morehouse College, where he is Executive Director of the Morehouse King Collection, the most extensive collection of King's personal writings including more than 10,000 pieces.
